- Evidence of Spanish language command (B1 SIELE or DELE) as minimum for students who do not come from Latin-American countries or Spain Passport
- Copy of passport

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ACADEMIC CREDIT SYSTEM

Credit: “Assign a value to a specific amount of training, know acquired or academic achievement, usually a unit of training evaluated or a module belonging to a training program, you can assign credits to learning outcomes or achievements, certifications acquired in other educational systems that are registered in revalidation, professional certifications, such as training for and at work, or those contemplated in the national system of competencies.”

ACADEMIC ACTIVITY	EXAMPLES	CRITERIA
Teaching: Instruction in front of the group in a theoretical, practical, or remote.	Classes, laboratories, seminars, workshops, Internet courses, etc.	15/16 hrs. = 1 credit
Supervised professional fieldwork.	Internships, social service, research summers, etc.	50 hrs. = 1 credit
Other individual or independent learning activities through tutoring and/or counseling	Theses, research projects, degree works, exhibitions, recitals, models, technological models, consultancies, links, lectures, conferences, congresses, visits, etc.	20 hrs. = 1 credit. To assign credits to each activity is due. (1) Specify and base the activity on the study plan. (2) Preset the% of credits that can be obtained in a specific program. (3) A terminal product that allows verifying the activity.

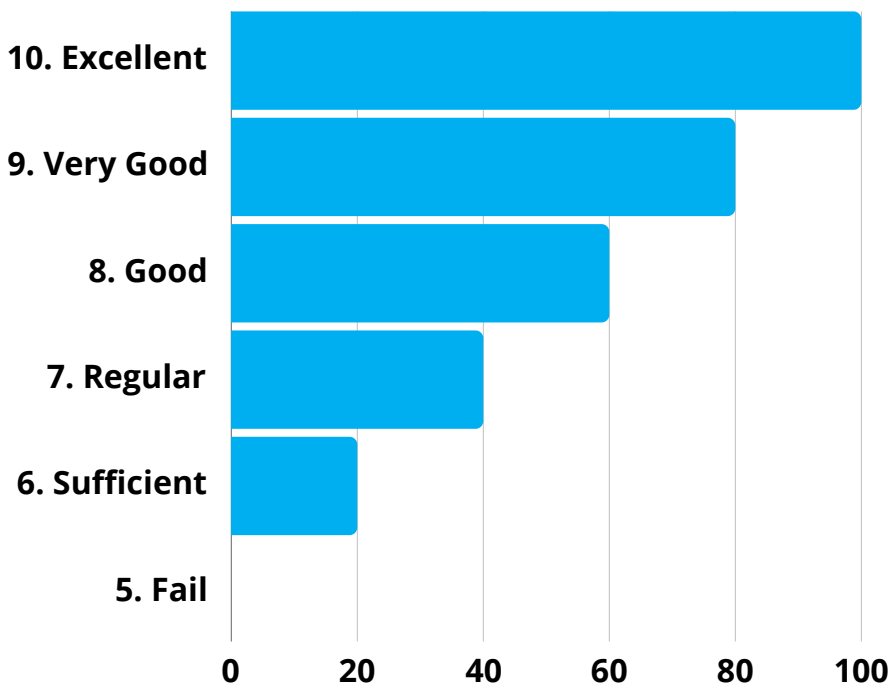




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GRADING SYSTEM

The minimum grade to consider an accredited course will be six, within a numerical scale of five to ten, with ten (10) being the grade highest and five (5) lowest.

APPROXIMATE COST OF LIVING

APPROXIMATE COST OF LIVING PER MONTH

Accommodation	\$3,000 - \$4,500 mexican pesos
Services (electricity, water, internet, mobile phone etc.)	\$500 - \$1,000 mexican pesos
Mobile payment	\$300 mexican pesos
Food cost	\$3,000 mexican pesos
Public transportation	\$250 - 400 mexican pesos
Academic supplies	\$200 - 500 mexican pesos

MEDICAL INSURANCE

International students **must** obtain, prior to their arrival in Mexico, an **international medical insurance** that must have the following characteristics:

- Repatriation of mortal remains (funeral expenses)
- That covers at least: accidents, travel assistance, medical assistance (including covid-19) liability.
- Legal assistance
- Transportation for a relative in case of hospitalization





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VISA

Visas are only needed if the student programme lasts 180 days or more. Please note that the student should request a visa at the nearest Mexican Consulate or Embassy prior to the departure to Mexico/to our country.
